WHEREAS, On April 28, 2012 MSGT Pruitt and three other Marines and Afghan Policeman were in one of four trucks making a routine military patrol run through “Zaranj”, a town in Afghanistan’s Nimruz Province, when suddenly there was an explosion . MSGT Pruitt was hit in the neck and legs with shrapnel and was killed;





SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 679

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REMEMBERING THE GALLANT SERVICE AND MOURNING THE LOSS OF MASTER SERGEANT SCOTT E. PRUITT FROM GAUTIER, MISSISSIPPI, WHO WAS LOST IN ACTION IN THE NIMRUZ PROVINCE OF AFGHANISTAN ON APRIL 28, 2012.

WHEREAS, the Department of Defense has announced that a decorated Marine from Gautier, Mississippi, was lost in action from an improvised explosive device during combat maneuvers in Afghanistan. Thirty-eight-year-old Master Sergeant Scott E. Pruitt died April 28, 2012, in Nimruz Province just two months after he volunteered to return to that country to lead his troops; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Pruitt was assigned to I Marine Expeditionary Force Headquarters Group, I Marine Expeditionary Force, based at Camp Pendleton, California; and

WHEREAS, he was set to retire in a year and had earned rank over an entire platoon, but he volunteered to go back into combat because he thought it was the right thing to do; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Pruitt graduated from Pascagoula High School in 1992, served in the Pascagoula High School Band, and earned a BA degree in Criminal Justice from the American Military University. He lived in Gautier when he enlisted in 1993; and

WHEREAS, Pruitt's title was Comptroller Chief and his occupational specialty was listed as a Financial Management Resource Analyst. He enlisted in June 1993 and his active duty service was scheduled to end June 23, 2013; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Pruitt will be buried with full military honors in Arlington National Cemetery on Tuesday, May 8, 2012; and

WHEREAS, Pruitt had received the Purple Heart Medal, the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal three times, as well as the Marine Corps Good Conduct Medal five times, among 15 other military honors. He is remembered as one who was extremely committed to accuracy and attention to detail in his work. He was also a good friend; and

WHEREAS, his fiancée, Trisha Lane, of Bristow, Virginia, met Pruitt when he was stationed in Quantico, Virginia. They had been together just over three years and were planning a wedding in Cocoa Beach, Florida, after he returned from deployment next year. He had ideal characteristics for a friend, father and Marine; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Pruitt is survived by two daughters, Jennifer, 9, and Jordyn, 4, who also live in California, and his fiancée, Tricia Anderson-Lane of Virginia who was looking forward to him being the stepfather of her children; and


WHEREAS, since the beginning of Operation Enduring Freedom in Iraq and Afghanistan, at least 79 soldiers or sailors with Mississippi ties have died in action. Scott was a father and son who is counted among America's heroes, committed to our nation's safety and security. To a country, a fallen soldier means a national loss; to a community, a fallen soldier means a true hero; to a child and parent, a fallen soldier means a father and son who won't be coming home. Mississippians understand the costs of conflict, because we have paid them in the past, and it is with great pride and humility that we recognize the heroic action of this great American and Mississippian, who was the guardian of civilization as we know it today:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That we do hereby remember the gallant service and mourn the loss of Master Sergeant Scott E. Pruitt from Gautier, Mississippi, who was lost in action in the Nimruz Province of Afghanistan, and extend the thoughts and prayers of a grateful state to his family in honor of their sacrifice and our sorrow on his passing

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to the surviving family of Master Sergeant Scott E. Pruitt and be made available to the Capitol Press Corps.





REQUEST:

Pursuant to the Mississippi Codes Annotated, 1972 § Title 21, Chapter 19, Section 11, the private property identified below was cleaned to the satisfaction of the Planning and Economic Development Director.

Per the attached invoice from TRI-STAR Demolition Service, who was authorized to secure all doors and lower level windows, remove exterior trash and debris, and perform routine yard maintenance, the City of Gautier, incurred a cost of \$948.32 combined with a penalty fee of \$1,500.00 equals a sum of \$2,448.32.

BACKGROUND:

This property was approved for private property clean up during the City of Gautier, Council Meeting and Public Hearing held on February 4, 2014. After considering staff, citizen, and neighbors comments during the public hearing, the mayor and city council approved the recommendation of staff to clean up the private property after the statutory 10-day appeal period from the date of council action and adjournment (March 4, 2014). The property executor was given the opportunity to clean the property before the city proceeded with a contractor to clean the property. TRI-STAR Demolition Service started the authorized clean up and securing the property on March 11, 2014 and completed the task on March 12, 2014, to the satisfaction of the Planning and Economic Development Department.

DISCUSSION:

Mississippi Statute provides procedures for municipalities to clean private property determined to be a menace to the municipal community thus:

The governing authority may by resolution adjudicate the actual cost of cleaning the property and may impose a penalty not to exceed One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) or fifty percent (50%) of the actual cost, whichever is more. The cost and any penalty may become a civil debt against the property owner, or, at the option of the governing authority, an assessment against the property. The "cost assessed against the property" means either the cost to the municipality of using its own employees to do the work or the cost to the municipality of any contract executed by the municipality to have the work done, and administrative costs and legal costs of the municipality.

(1) If the governing authority does not declare the cost and any penalty shall be collected as a civil debt, then the assessment above provided for shall be a lien against the property and may be enrolled in the office of the circuit clerk of the county as other judgments are enrolled, and the tax collector of the municipality shall, upon order of the board of governing authorities, proceed to sell the land to satisfy the lien as now provided by law for the sale of lands for delinquent municipal taxes.

(2) All decisions rendered under the provisions of this section may be appealed in the same manner as other appeals from municipal boards or courts are taken.

RECOMMENDATION:

The City of Gautier, Code Enforcement Officer be authorized to place a lien against the property in accordance with the attached ORDER and the provisions set forth pursuant of Mississippi Code Annotated, 1972 § 21-19-11, Cleaning and Clearing of Private Property.

To Whom It May Concern:

The City of Gautier, Mayor and City Council held a public hearing on February 4, 2013 pursuant to Mississippi Code Annotated 1972 § Title 21, Chapter 19, Section 11, concerning the above referenced property. After hearing, comments from local residents and staff the mayor and city council found the above referenced property to be in such a state of uncleanliness as to be a menace to the public health, safety and welfare of the community.


Based on the decision of the governing authority, if the owner does not do so by March 4, 2013, the city shall proceed to clean the land by the use of municipal workers or by contract. The scope of the work may include cutting grass and weeds, filling cisterns; removing rubbish, dilapidated fences, dilapidated building, personal property, debris, and draining standing water from the property. The city will also secure all exterior doors and windows. In addition, an active honeybee hive needs to be removed from the home. The house continues to reflect considerable structural damage and roof leaks and if not immediately corrected will accelerate the decaying property condition.

Additionally, the municipality may reenter the property or parcel of land for a period of one (1) year after the hearing without any further hearings. Notice will be posted on the property or parcel of land and at city hall or another place in the municipality where such notices are generally posted at least seven (7) days before the property or parcel of land is reentered for cleaning.


Again, you have until March 4, 2014, to clean the property as specified above and save any additional expenses associated with this clean up process. You also have the right to appeal in the same manner as other appeals from municipal decisions.




