REQUEST:

BACKGROUND:

On November 11, 2014, the City of Gautier received a Tidelands Grant Agreement from the Department of Marine Resources for a FY2015 Tidelands grant award in the amount of \$70,000.00 for the City Park Community Center Phase III Project. This phase is part of the overall City Park/Town Green Tidelands Project which has been ongoing for several years. The proposed budget includes two pavilions for the new Town Green. This grant requires no local match.

REQUEST:

Pursuant to the Mississippi Codes Annotated, 1972 § Title 21, Chapter 19, Section 11, the City of Gautier, Mayor and City Council should conduct a public hearing and receive public comment(s) regarding staff's recommendation to clean this private property.

BACKGROUND:

The Code Enforcement office has received complaints of the condition of the property and the safety concern of the abandoned in-ground swimming pool which is haphazardly covered with deteriorated plywood.

The Code Enforcement office is unable to contact the property owner. Neighbors are concerned for the health, safety and welfare of their neighborhood.

On February 19, 2015 a letter was sent to the owner of record that the City Staff would be requesting the City Council set a Public Hearing Date to determine if the property is a menace to public health, safety, and welfare. The owner of record was given a deadline of March 16, 2015 to comply with the code and secure any safety hazards.

On February 24, 2015, the Mayor and City Council set a public hearing date of March 17, 2015. The property owner was notified by letter, at the property address and the mailing address of record, of the hearing. Additionally, both the property and city bulletin board were posted with a copy of the public hearing notice two weeks prior to the scheduled hearing.

DISCUSSION:

The primary goal is to clean up and maintain the abandoned property pursuant to the Mississippi Codes Annotated, 1972 § Title 21, Chapter 19, Section 11. There are two remaining above ground structures and an in-ground swimming pool on the property. One of the structures is a boat house and appears to be in good shape. The staff do not foresee a safety concern for the boat house and do not recommend removal of that structure.

The other structure is a pool house. The pool house is considered an accessory structure and is in a very deteriorated/dilapidated state. The structure is elevated and not secured, so animals and humans can freely enter the structure at any time. There is an accumulation of animal waste within the structure. The structure is approximately 600 square feet which does not meet the minimum requirements for a primary structure for the R-1 Zoning District of 1,325 square feet.

The in-ground swimming pool is full of stagnant water and rotting debris. The pool is covered with dilapidated plywood. Large gaps have developed in the pool covering which present an unsafe environment. The covering, with gaps, makes the pool easily accessible, but difficult to escape.

The property in general appears to have been abandoned. The vegetation is overgrown and miscellaneous debris is scattered around the site.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends removal of the pool house structure, primary structure remnants, filling in the in-ground swimming pool, removing any other slabs/walks/protrusions that are deemed an “attractive nuisance”, and removal of debris and overgrown vegetation on the property.


Staff recommends the Mayor and Council allow the responsible party until April 1, 2015, to clean up and secure the property. This would allow for the prescribed statutory 10-day appeal period to expire. Staff recommends the property be cleaned by the City on or after April 2nd if the responsible party has not cleaned and secured the property at such date. A lien would then be placed on the property in accordance with the Mississippi Codes Annotated, 1972 § Title 21, Chapter 19, Section 11.

QUASI-JUDICIAL PROCEDURES

1. Announcement of Matter. Read the matter title to be considered.
2. Swear the Witnesses. All witnesses, parties, citizen participants and City Staff who plan to speak at the hearing shall collectively be sworn at the beginning of the hearing by the City Attorney.
3. Ex Parte Disclosure. All members must disclose on the record any ex parte communications, to include any physical inspections of the subject property. The disclosure should include with whom any communication has taken place, a summary of the substance of the communication, and the date of the site visit, if any. If anyone has received written communications, the writing must be presented, read into record or a copy provided to all participants, and made a part of the official record.
4. Applicant Presentation.
5. Questions directed to Applicant. The applicant should answer any questions by the public, the Planning Commission, or others.
6. Staff Presentation. This includes presentation of the staff report into the official record.
7. Objections from Applicant. Confirm whether there are objections from the applicant regarding the staff report or development order.
8. Questions directed to Staff. The staff answers any questions by the public, the Planning Commission, or others.
9. Public Comments. Members of the public should be allowed to make comments regarding the application.
10. Applicant rebuttal/final comments
11. Staff rebuttal/final comments
12. Call for final questions.
13. Close public portion of the hearing.
14. Motion & Deliberation. Planning Commission makes a motion, and debates and deliberates regarding the application and development order.
15. Vote.
16. Close the quasi-judicial proceeding.

BACKGROUND:

Section 6.2 of the Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) currently requires that, "Accessory uses and buildings shall be incidental to the principle use established on the same lot."

The UDO defines a "Lot" as a parcel of land that may be occupied by a building and accessory buildings, together with such open spaces and parking spaces or areas as are required under this Ordinance and having principle frontage upon a public or private street or right-of-way.

The UDO defines a "Site" as any lot or unplatted parcel or any combination of contiguous lots or unplatted parcels of land with its appurtenances and buildings having a unity of use and ownership.

DISCUSSION:

The UDO does not permit accessory uses and buildings on adjoining lots under the same ownership. Currently, when an application is made to put an accessory use on an adjacent lot to the principle structure, staff requires property owners go to the Jackson County Courthouse and collapse the lot lines to combine the contiguous lots into one lot. Frequently, lots cannot easily be combined due to mortgage issues, subdivision platting issues, title issues, etc.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Gautier Planning Commission and Staff recommend that City Council approve the proposed UDO Amendment.

Accessory Uses and Buildings

Section 6.2 of the Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) currently requires that, "Accessory uses and buildings shall be incidental to the principle use established on the same lot."

The UDO defines a "Lot" as a parcel of land that may be occupied by a building and accessory buildings, together with such open spaces and parking spaces or areas as are required under this Ordinance and having principle frontage upon a public or private street or right-of-way.

The UDO defines a "Site" as any lot or unplatted parcel or any combination of contiguous lots or unplatted parcels of land with its appurtenances and buildings having a unity of use and ownership.

The Amendment Process

Amendments to the UDO may be initiated by the City Council, the Gautier Planning Commission (GPC), the City Staff, or by a citizen. The process requires that the GPC review and forward a recommendation to the City Council on the proposed amending ordinance(s).

The City Council may consider approval after a public hearing based on the application and the relevant support materials, testimony at the public hearing, the GPC recommendation, and the Staff Report.

DISCUSSION:

The UDO does not permit accessory uses and buildings on adjoining lots under the same ownership. Currently, when an application is made to put an accessory use on an adjacent lot to the principle structure, staff requires property owners go to the Jackson County Courthouse and collapse the lot lines to combine the contiguous lots into one lot. Frequently, lots cannot easily be combined due to mortgage issues, subdivision platting issues, title issues, etc.

STAFF FINDINGS:

Staff finds that the requirement for any accessory uses/buildings/structures to be located on the same lot as the principle use puts an undue hardship on property owners in cases where property owners own two or more contiguous lots. Furthermore, requiring applicants to go through a lengthy process to collapse lot lines would not be considered being “business friendly.”

Staff finds that the probable intent of the “same lot” requirement is that an accessory use is not constructed without a principle use on a particular “Site.” Therefore, staff proposes an amendment to change any reference to the same “lot”, to the same “site”. Applicants would still be required to have an appropriate principle use on the site.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Staff recommends approval of the text amendment as presented.

The Planning Commission may:

1. Recommend that City Council approve the UDO Amendment; or
2. Recommend that City Council approve the UDO Amendment with changes; or
3. Recommend that City Council not approve the UDO Amendment.

REQUEST:

The Cultural Services Department requests authorization to submit a grant application to the Mississippi Department of Transportation (MDOT) for the 2015 Urban Youth Corps Program.

BACKGROUND:

The Urban Youth Corps Program is a youth employment and training service program which was originally established to: (1) offer meaningful full-time or productive summer work for individuals between the ages of 16 and 25 in transportation-related settings; (2) give the participants a mix of work experience and on-the-job training that includes a minimum of 10% of the participants' time for basic life skills, education, training, safety, etc.; and (3) provide the youths with an opportunity to develop citizenship values and skills through service to their communities and the State of Mississippi. If awarded, the City would hire approximately eight youths to work ten weeks during the summer to beautify the City's corridors, main thoroughfares and entrance sign landscaping. The grant reimburses the City up to \$35,000 and requires a 20% match of the total project cost in cash and/or in-kind payment through administrative and supervisory costs. The City has met this requirement in the past through in-kind supervision.

DISCUSSION:

The City of Gautier received Urban Youth Corps funding in 2011, 2012, and 2013. The participants provided valuable service to the City and received weekly trainings including life skills, landscape design, safety training, CPR and First Aid, and leadership development.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Cultural Services Department therefore recommends that City Council authorize submission of an Urban Youth Corps grant application to the Mississippi Department of Transportation for 2015 for an amount up to \$35,000.00 with a 20% local match.

The City Council may:

1. Authorize submission of a grant application for the 2015 Urban Youth Corps Program as described above with a 20% in-kind local match. The City also agrees to follow all Federal and State Rules and Regulations applicable to the program; or
2. Authorize submission of a grant application with changes, or
3. Disapprove submission of a grant application for 2015.

Currentness

(1) The governing authority of any municipality or the board of supervisors of any county are hereby authorized and empowered to appropriate money or dedicate and convey municipally-owned buildings and property or county-owned buildings and property, as the case may be, to the school district or districts situated within that municipality or county for the purpose of erecting, purchasing or otherwise providing the school building or a site for such school building of such school district, in cases where the governing authority or board of supervisors are of the opinion that the location of such school building within the corporate limits of the municipality or the county, or in close proximity thereto, will be of special benefit to the inhabitants of the municipality or county.

(2) Municipalities, municipal police departments and the sheriffs' departments may contract with the school board of any school district to provide additional Law Enforcement Officers Training Academy-certified police protection to said school district on such terms and for such reimbursement as the school district and the entity may agree in their discretion.

(3) The governing authority of any municipality or the board of supervisors of any county may allow off-duty municipal or county law enforcement officers who are hired individually for security purposes by the school district or districts within that municipality or county to use municipal or county law enforcement uniforms and equipment during such off-duty employment.

(4) The governing authority of any municipality, in its discretion, may donate funds, equipment or in-kind services to any school district located within the boundaries of the municipality to assist the voluntary character development or public service programs of that school district.

Dear Mr. Mallette:

Attorney General Hood is in receipt of your request for an official opinion and it has been assigned to me for research and reply.

Issues Presented

May the City of Oxford waive charges for building permits and inspection fees in the nature of a donation to a new school?

May the City of Oxford undertake a partial waiver of such charges or fees, in the nature of a donation to a new school under Section 21-19-49?

Response

Yes. If the appropriate factual findings are made by and placed in the minutes of the governing authority, Section 21-19-49 authorizes the City to waive permit or inspection fees. Such a waiver would constitute a donation of funds or in-kind services.

Background

Your letter states:

I write on behalf of the City of Oxford. Mississippi Code Annotated Section 21-19-49 allows a municipality, upon proper findings, to appropriate money to a school district for the purpose of, among other things, erecting a school building. The Oxford School District is currently preparing to seek bids for a new high school. The School District is likely to request that the City of Oxford waive certain development and building-related fees, such as building permit and inspection fees.

Section 21-19-49 does not specifically address waiver of fees. The City understands that the school district is subject to the City's building codes and permit fees. MS AG Op., Mitchell (June 26, 2006). The City also understands that a municipality may waive building codes and permit fees if such waiver is made under the authority of an ordinance setting forth the conditions under which such a waiver might be granted. MS AG Op., Hewes (January 28, 2005). The City of Oxford has no such ordinance in place. However, I have found no opinions discussing the ability of a municipality to waive charges for permit fees and inspections if such waiver is in the nature of a donation under Section 21-19-49.

Therefore, the City's question is whether it may waive charges for building permits and inspection fees, in the nature of a donation to a new school. The City also asks whether it may undertake a partial waiver of such charges or fees, in the nature of a donation to a new school under Section 21-19-49. In its view, if the Board of Alderman could simply appropriate money and give it to the school district for the purpose of erecting a building, it would seem that it could effect the same purpose by waiving the requirement of the permit and inspection fees. However, it asks for your office's guidance on the question.

Applicable Law and Analysis


The appointment expires May 1, 2015, and we give you notice so the City can consider and make its appointment in a timely fashion.
